Overall Goals:

- 1. Enhance Grammar Comprehension: Students should be able to achieve a comprehensive understanding of various English grammar points.
- 2. Enhance Vocabulary: Students should be able to acquire and effectively use a broad range of vocabulary related to daily life and specific contexts.
- 3. Improve Communication Skills: Students should be able to become proficient in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English.
- 4. Practical Application: Students should be able to use English in practical, real-life situations.

- 2. Continuous Assessment: Use interactive assignments to monitor progress.

Methods:

- Interactive Lectures: Present grammar rules and vocabulary with examples.
- Practice Exercises: Use worksheets and online exercises for practice..
- Listening and Reading Activities: Use multimedia resources to enhance comprehension.

- **Group Discussions: Foster communication skills through group discussions on various topics.

Teaching Steps:

- 1. Simple Present, Negative and Questions
 - Explain the formation and usage.
 - Provide affirmative, negative, and interrogative sentence examples.
 - Practice through oral drills and written exercises.
- 2. Present Simple vs. Present Continuous
 - Compare and contrast the two tenses.
 - Use visual aids like timelines.
- Conduct activities where students describe ongoing actions vs. habitual actions.
- 3. Possessive Adjectives and Demonstratives
 - Introduce and practice possessive adjectives.
 - Create sentences and short dialogues.
- 4. Some or Any, Much, Many or A Lot of?
 - Explain usage with countable and uncountable nouns.
 - Interactive exercises using classroom objects.
- 5. Imperatives and Asking for Information
 - -Practice on scenarios like asking for directions.
 - Practice giving and following commands.
- 6. Past Simple and Past Continuous
- Explain the past simple for completed actions and past continuous for ongoing actions in the past.
- 7. Comparatives and Superlatives
 - Introduce rules for forming comparatives and superlatives.
 - Activities comparing objects.
- 8. Must and Should, Adverbs of Manner
 - Explain and differentiate necessity, obligation, and advice.
 - Practice adverbs through scenario-based activities.
- 9. Relative Pronouns and Clauses, Reflexive Pronouns
 - Teach relative clauses and their function.
 - Use reflexive pronouns in sentences.
 - Practice through sentence completion and transformation exercises.

10. Like and Would Like

- Explain differences and usage.
- Exercises on preferences and polite requests.

Vocabulary Sessions:

- 1. Jobs and Professions, Hand Actions, Clothes, Negative Adjectives
 - Use picture descriptions and matching exercises.
 - Scenario-based activities based on different professions.

2. Reading and Listening Activities

- Use stories like "Leaving Home" and "Best Friends".
- Listening tasks followed by comprehension questions.

Teacher 2: Marisa Faion

Methods:

- Lecture and Interactive Discussions: Present grammar concepts and vocabulary.
- Task-Based Learning: Assign real-life tasks and projects.
- Reading and Listening Comprehensions: Use various texts and audio resources.
- Group Work: Encourage collaborative learning.

Teaching Steps:

- 1. Future Simple (Going to / Will / Present Continuous)
 - Explain different future forms and their usage.
 - Practice through prediction activities and future plans discussion.

2. Can/Could, May/Might

- Teach modal verbs for ability, permission, and possibility.
- Scenario-based activities for asking and giving permission.

3. Review of Have to/Don't Have to/Must/Must Not/Should

- Consolidate understanding through revision exercises.
- Create scenarios for advice, necessity, and prohibition.

4. Present Perfect Simple

- Introduce the present perfect tense.
- Practice using time expressions like already, just, yet.
- Compare with past simple using timelines and activities.

5. Conditionals (1st and 2nd)

- Explain the structure and usage of conditional sentences.
- Engage students in creating hypothetical scenarios.
- 6. Questions with and without Auxiliaries
 - Practice forming and answering different types of questions.
 - Conduct interviews and information-gap activities.

Vocabulary Sessions:

- 1. Verb Phrases, Opposite Verbs, Confusing Verbs
 - Practice through matching exercises and context-based activities.
- 2. The Airport, The House, Holidays
 - Use visual aids and realia.
 - Use of scenario-based activities.
- 3. Prepositions (In/On/At), Verbs and Prepositions
 - Practice through location-based activities.
 - Sentence completion and correction exercises.
- 4. Make/Do, Get, Places and Buildings, Expressions of Movement
 - Explain differences and contexts.
 - Use of scenario-based activities.
- 5. Reading and Listening Activities
 - Use passages related to vacations and everyday scenarios.
 - Comprehension exercises to reinforce learning.
